A Summary of 2007 Services

The Community & Career Exploration & Apprenticeship Program (CCEAP)

400 COMMUNITY ADULTS SPENT MORE THAN 7,000 HOURS SHARING THEIR WORKPLACES WITH YOUTH LAST YEAR.

The Community & Career Exploration & Apprenticeship Program is open to all Tompkins County youth ages 11-20, who are living with a parent or guardian and includes youth who participate on a volunteer basis and those who participate on a stipended (paid) basis.

The CCEAP is a vehicle for a diverse group of young people to explore their interests, gain new skills, and contribute to our community by participating in community/career exploration tours, community service projects and apprenticeships under the one-to-one guidance of adult mentors. From small engine repair to sailing, electrical engineering to equine research, retail sales to restaurant management, law enforcement to legal assisting and website design to robotic design, young people step into the adult world.

- 89 The percentage of parents who reported that their child achieved what they had hoped their child would gain through our services.



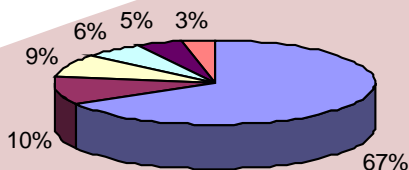
